
What Drives Happiness Around The World?







Motivation:

Government leaders can use happiness indicators to inform their policy-making decisions.

The Western European countries of Norway, Denmark, Iceland, and Sweeden have consistently been named the top 4 happiest countries over the last three years. Canada, Australia, and New Zealand consistently score above the **United States.**

Data Description:

The World Happiness Report available from Kaggle consists of three .csv files from 2015-2017 and includes a happiness score for 155 countries. It also shows how much of the happiness score can be explained by six factors. GDP, Family, Life Expectancy, Freedom, Government Corruption, and Generosity.
